


ACHAL's Mission Statement

ACHAL's Objectives

- To enable Christian workers to find affordable homes near their church or place of ministry.
- To heighten awareness of the need for affordable housing for such workers among Christians in churches and business communities, by showing how prohibitive housing costs weaken Christian witness in the city.
- To strengthen relationships between those ACHAL supports and those who give and in doing so create wider support networks and reciprocal sharing.

Laying foundations for future success

I am delighted and privileged to introduce our Special Review, recording highlights of 15 years of service to meet the housing needs of key Christian workers in London.

This Review gives me the opportunity to pay tribute to the vision and commitment of those who started this work, many of whom continue to play a part today. On behalf of the Management Committee I thank all our supporters for their prayers, past service and financial gifts. The growth of ACHAL's portfolio of properties and services is a testimony of God's provision through the imagination, faith and resources of many Christians.

ACHAL derives its name from Amersham Road in New Cross where the work began in 1988. Since then ACHAL has helped 34 Christian workers, both married and single and from different denominational and ethnic backgrounds. All are workers for London churches or Christian organisations whose housing needs do not qualify them for statutory help. For some time we have wondered whether it is appropriate to continue to use the word Amersham in our title and we are prayerfully considering a change of name.

Our vision

Our heart's desire is to see churches and Christian organisations resourced with key workers who can make known the unconditional love of Jesus to the people of London. We are hoping our new name will reflect this commitment.

This ongoing vision for supporting Christian witness in London shapes all that we do. We work in partnership with individuals, churches, Christian businesses and grant-making Trusts who provide the financial resources we need. A highlight of our past growth came in 1998 when we experienced a property expansion from the liquidation of London Christian Housing plc. Through the wonderful generosity of their shareholders, six properties with Christian tenants, were added to ACHAL's portfolio with a further £100,000 made available to us in low-cost loans.

Our Treasurer, John Woodman, has monitored our affairs throughout and we are so fortunate to have his acumen and wisdom in keeping our finances on a sound footing. Our confidence to grow is underpinned by his expertise.

Abundant opportunities

The following stories of key workers housed by ACHAL show that there are abundant opportunities for sharing the Gospel with people from diverse cultural and racial communities in London. The harvest is ready but the workers are few, sometimes, simply because Christian workers are unable to afford a place to live from where to effectively witness and minister to local people.

Our challenge is to find the financial resources needed to house more key workers. Over the next five years we aim to raise £1 million to help purchase additional properties and to employ an Executive Director to expand our services. We invite present and new supporters to invest in this venture and to join us in seeing Christian witness strengthened in London.

Brick by brick - The story so far

Currently ACHAL house 25 key workers either as tenants in properties owned by ACHAL, or in shared ownerships. In addition, ACHAL provides some low cost housing loans. In nine London boroughs, from East Finchley to New Cross and from Forest Gate to Streatham, Christian workers housed by ACHAL are being 'salt and light' in their communities sharing God's love and hope with people around them.

Helping change people's lives

Kim is the Project Co-ordinator of Crossroads Christian Counselling Service (CCCS), a charity run by six churches in Tower Hamlets. CCCS offers professional counselling to local residents struggling with emotional problems, such as bereavement, depression, impact of abuse, stress and family breakdown. So far, Kim and other counsellors have offered 7,800 sessions to 242 individuals, children or families.



In order to work at CCCS. Kim needed a place to live in Tower Hamlets. ACHAL bought her a flat and set an affordable rent, Kim says, "Without ACHAL's help, I wouldn't be able to afford to live or work in Tower Hamlets. CCCS is here today partly because of ACHAL's support which has helped to change the lives of 242 people!"

ACHAL ... Offering the best housing solutions

ACHAL is committed to finding the best housing solutions that meet the unique needs of each individual or family. Requests for housing are carefully assessed and suggestions are made as to the best way forward. For example, through our 'Save a Home' scheme we bought a share in a property owned by a family who were embarking on overseas mission. ACHAL now lets this house to other Christian workers on a short-term basis.

Finding the right place

In 1994, Ryan, a youth worker at the Good Shepherd Mission in Bethnal Green and his family lived in rented accommoda-

tion in East London. However, after a while their landlord decided to re-develop the property as a commercial venture. Ryan and Susanne started looking for a new home in Bethnal Green where church and work were located. After evaluating their financial and ministry situation, ACHAL suggested a way


forward. The families of Ryan and Susanne could offer some capital for the deposit and ACHAL would provide a low cost loan. This financial agreement enabled Ryan and Susanne to make an offer on an ex-council flat in Bethnal Green.

ACHAL!

As well as providing affordable housing, ACHAL takes a keen interest in the ministries of Christian workers it serves. We ask our members, supporters and associates to pray for each other and we invite Christian workers we are housing to share about their ministries at our annual meetings.

A generous provision, an answer to prayer

Andrew and Debbie live in North London and work with Turning Point, an Operation Mobilisation (OM) outreach ministry to Muslims. They lead a bilingual English-Turkish fellowship, which involves a Sunday service, evangelism and discipleship classes, a regular outreach for women and a drop-in centre for Turkish-speaking refugees. In addition, they offer workshops for local churches that want to get involved in evangelistic outreach to local people.



jobs or getting involved in another ministry elsewhere, which would have been really hard because their hearts are very much with the Turkish people.

Whilst exploring their options, friends from OM encouraged Andrew and Debbie to apply to ACHAL for help. Having assessed their particular ministry and financial situation ACHAL told its members about this need and invited their prayer and financial support. In response to this invitation, finances were provided through ACHAL to bridge the gap between this family's resources and the agreed price of a property. Thanks to ACHAL's offer of a shared ownership scheme, Andrew and Debbie are now able to continue their valuable ministry amongst the Turkish community in London.



A fruitful year ahead

We are on course for another fruitful year in 2003/2004. Recently we assisted two families of key Christian workers through shared ownership, one in Brixton and another in Hackney. In the future, we will continue to develop strategic partnerships with London churches and Christian organisations, in order to address the growing needs for affordable housing for key Christian workers.

These have all enabled an expansion in the Association's property portfolio, giving rise to increased Housing Activity Income and Housing Costs.

Income Resources for 2002 = £332,038

Including: £59,706 - donations £88,000 - equity and private loans

£66,197 - housing activity

Outgoing Resources for 2002 = £202,373

Including: £61,201 - additions to housing stock

£50,000 - low cost loans (advanced)

£17,780 - administration

Housing Stock units at cost = £1,116,207

(current estimated value of £2.4m)

ACHAL continues to keep the administration costs low so that most of the capital is used for housing purposes. Small donations contribute to administration costs, but gifts of £1,000 and above are now used for new housing projects. Even with the affordable rents the current housing stock generates sufficient revenue to fund the maintenance budget and pay the mortgages. This is because properties are purchased partly through donations and do not solely rely on commercial capital.

Building partnerships through prayer and finances



Behind everything we have achieved are our valued supporters, individuals, churches, and Christian grant-making Trusts who provide most of the funds needed for purchasing new properties and offering shared ownerships. During 2002 we received over £38,000 in gifts from individuals, churches and Trusts and another £43,000 was made available to ACHAL in interest free or low interest loans.

Individually negotiated long-term loans are the 'financial lifeblood' of our service. To date, we have a portfolio of £145,000 private loans to ACHAL from Christians who want their financial resources to have multiplied ministry impact.

A woman with a generous heart

Sometime ago a young woman was helped by ACHAL to purchase her home through a shared ownership scheme. Soon after, she received an unexpected legacy and used that money to pay off her mortgage and buy out ACHAL's share of her flat. At the same time as the buy out she made a sizeable donation to say 'thank you'.

Since then she has also made a large loan to ACHAL that bears little interest rather than invest the rest of her legacy commercially. She says, "I enjoy being able to help ACHAL this way and I know that my money is making a difference for God's Kingdom." Her loan did make a difference - especially in 2002, when it enabled ACHAL to go ahead with another shared ownership.

We praise God for people who share our vision of supporting Christian witness in London. There are many opportunities for individuals and churches to get involved as we seek to respond to growing housing needs of Christian workers:

- Opportunities for individuals and churches to offer financial and prayer support as we consider new applicants for our housing schemes.
- Opportunities for individuals to get involved in supporting Christian witness in London by making low interest loans to ACHAL.
- Opportunities for Christian businessmen and women to serve as voluntary members of our Management Committee.
